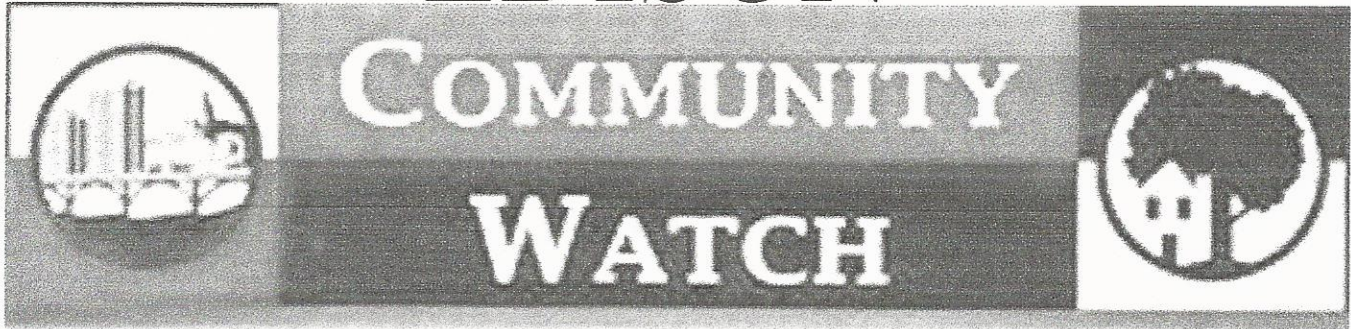

CAR-JACKING PREVENTION TIPS

- Always lock your car doors and keep your windows up high enough so a potential jacker cannot get his/her hand or arm in the window
- Observe your surroundings. Be conscious of any activity near your car. Car-jackers pick on people who don’t seem alert.
- When stopping in traffic, always keep a safe distance between you and the car in front of you. If you have to make a quick get away you will be able to turn your wheel and move without being boxed in.
- Be suspicious of people approaching your car, asking for directions, handing out flyers or asking for help.
- If a suspicious person approaches your car, drive away carefully.
- If another driver bumps your car, keep your doors locked and windows up. Drive to the nearest police or fire station or a well-lighted, populated area.
- Be alert when using drive-up ATM machines.
- If you suspect someone is following you, don’t go home. Drive to the nearest police or fire station or a well-lighted, populated area for help.
- If you have a cell phone, call 911 for help.
